





Philanthropic Opportunities: Logistics support



CHL's diverse training programs - DESLH, CLP and PLC - involve complex logistics and require a dedicated team for each training

to manage the organisational aspects of the course.

Travel to and from the in-person unit training for course academics, coaches and other support staff, as well as accommodation, subsistence, course material translation and IT infrastructure generate significant costs for the program.

As humanitarian crises situations are spreading across continents, there is a growing need for more localised and context-specific training in humanitarian leadership. CHL is expanding its crisis leadership training to new geographical areas to address these needs.



Donation tiers (annual and three-year commitment)

AUD 25,000 - AUD 100,000 annual / AUD 75,000 - AUD 300,000 over 3 years

Logistics Support tiers: logistics support may include financial or in-kind support to cover the following cost bases:

Residential / F&B	AUD 75,000	AUD 225,000	Accommodation for both academic personnel and course students on site at residential units over 1 week
Systems Support	AUD 50,000	AUD 150,000	Systems support involves both IT support throughout the courses for all staff and students and the cost of translating the course into multiple languages to provide more localised CLP training.
Recruitment	AUD 25,000	AUD 75,000	Student recruitment involves outreach programs, online media campaigns, events and continuous liaison with local and international NGOs as well as UN organisations.
